Adminstration of justice is based on the principle that crimes and criminals are punishable. The law classifies crimes according to their seriousness or leniency, which results in corresponding sanctions being imposed. The classification depends on factors such as nature, gravity, extent, and consequences. It is also important for maintaining social order and security of the state (Wang, 2024). In most cases, crimes are divided into two main groups: offenses against the person or property (criminal law) and violations that do not fall within this category, such as administrative or civil infractions. Crime prevention is a fundamental aspect of crime control in modern society. The United States has been able to reduce its murder rate by 50 percent since reaching its peak in the early 1980s (Savolainen, 2004). This achievement was achieved through various mechanisms such as policing, prisons and criminal justice systems. In most cases, prevention is a better option than punishment because it minimizes negative effects on society while maximizing the benefits for citizens. Several methods can be used to deter criminal activity, including incapacitation of offenders (i.e., imprisonment), rehabilitation programs and education. Another important element to consider is that law enforcement agencies must work together with other relevant sectors of society, such as schools or the media, to ensure the effectiveness of crime prevention measures. In recent years, the use of technology has played a significant role in improving criminal justice systems and deterring crimes (Robbins & Sherman, 2007). For example, law enforcement agencies are now able to access databases that store information about criminals such as their biometric data, which helps them identify individuals who may pose a threat. This can lead to faster apprehension of offenders and better management of crime rates in society (Higgins & Kaminski, 2014). A major challenge facing policymakers is how best to balance the goals of punishment and rehabilitation for criminal justice purposes (McNeil, 2009). While deterrence aims at preventing crimes by applying sanctions that are sufficiently severe to discourage offenders from repeating their criminal behavior, rehabilitation seeks to reform criminals so they can become law-abiding members of society. The most effective approach is likely to combine these two strategies in order to reduce crime while also providing a second chance for those who have made mistakes (Savolainen, 2004). The debate over whether the criminal justice system should focus more on punishment or rehabilitation continues today. Some argue that harsher penalties are necessary in order to deter criminals from committing crimes and ensure public safety (McNeil, 2009). Others believe that investing resources into programs

designed to help offenders become productive members of society is a better approach because it can reduce recidivism rates over time. In conclusion, the criminal justice system plays an essential role in maintaining social order and security within societies. The balance between punishment and rehabilitation is crucial for effectively controlling crime while also offering individuals who have committed crimes a chance to reform themselves. Additionally, collaboration among various sectors of society such as law enforcement agencies, schools or the media can improve the efficacy of crime prevention measures through better use of technology (Higgins & Kaminski, 2014). (2 Writers' Notes - The Unreasonable Man by Rebecca Goldman – Book Review The Unreasonable Man was written in the late sixties, when American society and its institutions were undergoing radical changes. This book is one of the few attempts to understand these social transformations from within an individual family system. It does not attempt to provide a grand theory about how families deal with such changes; rather it tells us what happened at the level of the human heart (and mind). The Unreasonable Man describes the life story of George, who grew up in New England and went through most of his education there as well. The book begins by recounting the author's own experience as an adolescent trying to understand her father when she first moved back home from college. She wanted him to give her advice about how to solve a problem with one of her classes, but he never offered this type of help because his parenting style was based on allowing children to learn through their mistakes. George had been born into an upper-class family in 1940s New England. His father (whose first name is not mentioned), although a brilliant engineer and scientist, suffered from depression during most of his life which resulted in him becoming distant with everyone but his wife; he was often abusive towards her as well. Rebecca Goldman tells us that George's parents did their best to shield their children from the harsh realities around them because they wanted to protect their children's innocence. As a result, George grew up largely ignorant of any political or social issues at all; he learned about these things only when it was too late and there was no going back for him once adulthood had arrived upon its unwelcome arrival. This unintentional lack of education on the part of his parents is one reason why George developed such an unusually high degree of tolerance towards others: He never learned how to see anything through anyone else's eyes because nobody ever showed him any examples for this purpose during childhood years when he could have benefited most from them (even though they didn't try actively). Instead, George was taught lessons by life itself as it unfolded around him. And what did that teach him? To be unreasonable about other people – a trait which ultimately became his greatest source of strength. Rebecca Goldman explains this in several different ways throughout the book: firstly through stories told within her own family (which is why she chose to write it), but also by analyzing George's life experiences as well; she argues that one cannot understand why someone like him developed into such a strong-willed, sometimes unreasonable person without examining all aspects of his life – including those which may seem insignificant on the surface. The Unreasonable Man is about how an upper class American family dealt with radical social changes in their lives while also trying not to impose too much influence from these external forces upon themselves and each other within their own private domain. Rebecca Goldman writes this book for those who find it difficult or impossible (or unwise) otherwise; she makes no claim that her subject matter should be accepted universally but merely wants readers to know about someone whose life was quite unlike anyone else's because they came from a different social class background than most Americans do nowadinas. This does not mean she thinks all upper-class families are alike however – far from it! In fact, Rebecca Goldman argues that there is an unreasonable degree of difference between classes when looking at family relationships; and this comes as no surprise considering how much our society values certain types over others based on money or social status. It's true that George never quite fits in with most people due to his unique upbringing (although perhaps he would have if things were different), but even so we learn why he developed such strong convictions about life and what makes him believe these are right after all? The Unreasonable Man begins with a story told by Rebecca Goldman's mother, who recounted her own experiences as an adolescent. This narrative gives us insight into how George grew up within his family: he never learned much about social issues during childhood because

nobody ever showed him any examples for this purpose (even though they didn't try actively). The second chapter deals with Rebecca Goldman's relationship with her father and provides background information on why she decided to write a book like this one. Chapter three continues by discussing George's childhood further while also touching upon his adult life as well; here we learn more about what happened between them after college until their estrangement took place several years later (which eventually ended up having tragic consequences). The final chapter covers Rebecca Goldman's reflections on her own family and its members. While most readers will probably find this section somewhat redundant because much of it has already been discussed earlier in the book, there are still some interesting observations to be made here about why families behave differently based upon their social class background - especially those who come from an upper-class one like George did during his upbr Writers' Notes - The Unreasonable Man by Rebecca Goldman - Book Review The Unreasonable Man is a book written by Rebecca Goldman, published in 1969. It was her first novel and tells the story of an unconventional family living during America's social upheavals in the late sixties. The main character is George Goldman, who grew up as part of a privileged but emotionally distant upper-class household in New England; he had a difficult childhood because his parents were both depressed and never seemed to understand him well enough before they divorced when he was a teenager (which led to further problems later on). The author explores how this experience shaped George's personality, leading him down an unconventional path that didn't fit into the societal norms of his time.
